- Dip the cut end in rooting hormone (optional, but recommended).
- Potting Up: Plant the cuttings in a well-draining potting mix, burying the bottom node.
- Creating a Humid Haven: Cover the pot with a clear plastic bag or use a humidity dome to maintain moisture.
- Rooty Results: In 4-6 weeks, gently tug on the cuttings
